OVERVIEW

We founded Open Claim Vineyards to grow benchmark Pinot Noir and Chardonnay on a Willamette Valley property our family has tended for over 20 years. Situated near Mt.

Pisgah in the last foothills of the coastal range, Open Claim is a premier 55-acre site planted in 2012 to 21 acres. Honoring the land and respect for nature inspires all of our decision making—from the use of solely organic practices and dry farming to encouraging biodiversity through the preservation of our property's unique oak enclave and wildlife corridor. We provide fruit for a few select clients, and work with Tony Rynders to vinify our limited production estate wines.



VINEYARD

Our vineyard is a 55-acre site at the base of Mt. Pisgah, most distinguished by an amphitheater of ancient oaks. Together with Results Partners, we planted 21 acres in 2012, and today cultivate 10 clones in a very intentional array: 10 blocks including 18 acres of Pinot Noir (Pommard, Wädenswil, 114, 115, 943, 667, 777, 828) and 3 acres of Chardonnay (95, 76).

Mt. Pisgah endows in other ways. We are buffered from the winds that funnel through the Van Duzer Corridor into the valley. And, at our elevation, we hover above the frost danger that can occur as the colder, damp air drains down. The land tilts at a perfect 4-degree south-facing slope to the sun. Morning fog provides whatever moisture winter rains forget.

Our diverse array of soils, Willakenzie, Bellpine and Rickreall among them, combine with glacial rocks from the Missoula floods to create the ideal, if stubborn, terroir essential to Chardonnay and Pinot Noir.
